

PE and Sports Grant

The government is providing additional funding of £150 million per annum for Primary Schools. This funding - provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport - has been allocated to primary school Headteachers.

This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools.

Purpose of funding

Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but schools have been given the freedom to choose how they do this. A list of possible uses has been suggested.

Moseley Primary School has decided to use the money to:

- employ a Sports Coach to work alongside our teachers when teaching PE in order to strengthen teaching and learning in this subject across school
- increase the amount of competitive sport at school
- pay for professional development opportunities for teachers in PE and sport
- increase pupils' participation in the sports and physical activities
- provide places for pupils on after school sports clubs
- improve resources to support the development of the subject
