

PE and Sports Grant 2022-23

The government provides additional funding for Primary Schools. This funding - provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport - has been allocated to primary school Headteachers.

This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools.

Purpose of funding

Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but schools have been given the freedom to choose how they do this. A list of possible uses has been suggested.

Moseley Primary School has decided to use the money to:

- Use a Sports Coach to strengthen teaching and learning in this subject across school
- Facilitate a Sports Apprentice to extend provision and support training
- Increase the amount of competitive sport at school post Covid
- Pay for professional development opportunities for teachers in PE and sport
- Increase pupils' participation in the sports and physical activities
- Improve resources to support the development of sport and PE

Impact of Previous Year's Spend: (£19,552)

- All children received high quality PE tuition each week resulting in a developing set of skills
- The culture of the school has changed encompassing a commitment to PE and sport
- School teams were established and the school entered football, rugby, netball, athletics, rounders and cricket competitions with a good level of success
- Pupil voice indicates high level of engagement in PE lessons
- School minibus has better enabled access to competitions
- School sports clubs are all well attended
