

In History, we will be studying Emperors and Empires with a focus on the Romans. We will learn about the growth and decline of the Roman Republic and the Roman Empire. We will discover the absolute power of the Roman emperors and study the hierarchies of Roman society and the Roman army. We will study the first invasions of Britain in 55 and 54 BC and the Roman conquest of Britain in AD 43. We will learn about Boudicca's rebellion, Hadrian's Wall and the Romanisation of Britain, including how Christianity came to Britain and investigate the legacy of Roman Britain in our local area. To complement our work in school, there will be a trip to the Corinium Museum more details to follow on the MCAS app.

In Science, we will study the Plant Nutrition and Reproduction project, identify parts of plants and their

function. Our investigations will include observing fibrous roots and taproots and investigate how water and nutrients are transported in plants. We will create the life cycle of a flowering plant and learn the parts and functions of flower parts. We will learn how to ask scientific questions.





In art lessons will link to our Science work as we work on the topic of Beautiful Botanicals. We will create natural weavings, prints and beautiful and detailed botanical paintings of fruit.
