This term we are learning about:



As Geographers, we will learn about allotments in the UK and how the government encouraged people to have them to support food rationing during WW2. We will learn about food webs and animal life cycles, including how living things are dependent on one another within a habitat. As investigators, we will discover the different ways that plants reproduce and will dissect flowering plants to identify the different structures. We will look at farming in the UK and the techniques used in modern farming, including the challenges that farmers face. We will research the benefits of eating seasonally and about the pros and cons of importing food. We will also learn about world farming and how the different climate zones affect where different foods can be grown.



As <u>Artists</u>, we will explore the work of Pablo Picasso and Rembrandt and introduce a range of shading techniques. We will create black and white photographs and use pencil, pen and ink wash to reimagine their photographs in a shaded drawing.

In <u>Computing</u>, we will become game creators that plan a game, design and create the game environment and create the game quest.

As <u>Scientists</u>, we will learn what life cycles are, order the stages of life cycles for different animal species and compare them. We will learn the five key mammalian characteristics. We will also learn about the stages and processes of the human life cycle. We will investigate how humans change and develop from infants to adolescence in the juvenile stage and learn about the changes that happen during puberty. We will learn about how humans change as they get older.

In <u>Design Technology</u>, children will learn about the meaning and benefits of seasonal eating, including food preparation and cooking techniques.
